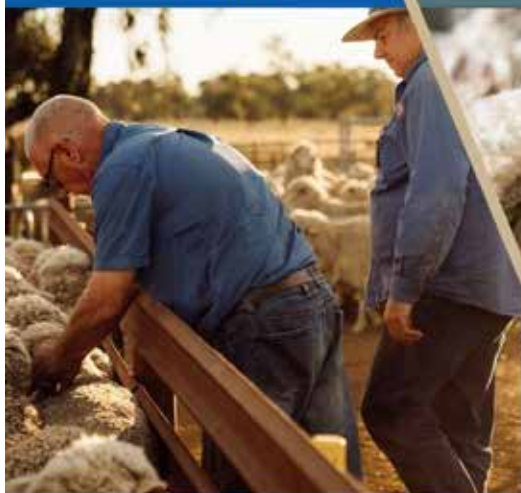

GENERAL REGULATIONS

STEWARDS

- Each steward to be at the Showground at appointed time to receive exhibits.
- All volunteers/stewards must sign attendance book on arrival and departure.
- Stewards are responsible for seeing that the exhibits are properly classed according to entry and all exhibits in such Section placed together for judging.
- Committee will see that all non-stewards leave the pavilion when judging commences but stewards are asked to also assist if necessary. Stewards will not permit anyone to be in the vicinity of the Judges while they are judging.
- One or more Stewards may attend on the Judges to respond if any information is required, but will not do or say anything to influence their decision. They must not reveal the name of the exhibitor or repeat any remarks the Judges may make to each other.
- Stewards will deliver results to the Secretary as soon as possible after completion of Judging to enable prize money to be prepared and pavilion most successful exhibitor award to be finalised.
- Pavilion Stewards will attend their respective Classes from 5.00 to 5.30 p.m. on the second day of the Show to supervise the collection of exhibits and the handing out of prize money and awards and further to assist in packing up.

JUDGES

- Judges will report to the Chief Steward of their Class at the hour appointed and also sign in.
- Judges, as they arrive at their decision will advise the attending Steward of the winning exhibit number/s award. Remarks may be recorded on the Results Sheet. Additional placings can be mentioned in case of protest.
- The Judges may recommend as they see fit any exhibit of special merit not in-

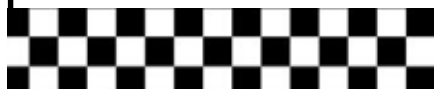

- Judges will disqualify any exhibits which, in their opinion, do not comply with the regulations and shall enter the reason on the Stewards Sheet.

SPECIAL ATTENTION OF ALL STEWARDS, JUDGES AND EXHIBITORS

- All Stewards must withdraw while judging of exhibits in which they are interested, directly or indirectly, is taking place. Any exhibitor or his/her representative who, before the judging is completed in a section in which he/she is interested, is seen showing exhibits or talking near his/her exhibits to the Judge of the relevant Section, will render all his/her exhibits in the Show liable to disqualification.
- MISCONDUCT. There is zero tolerance to misconduct. Verbal and/or physical abuse directed towards another competitor, a steward or Judge IS misconduct. This may result in a ban from Ag Shows. Please report any misconduct to the Show Society Chief Steward, Secretary or President.

All Rules and Regulations herein apply to exhibitors, Judges and Stewards of Class A-Ring Events: Class B-Merino Sheep: Class C-Fleece Wool: Class D-Cattle: Class F Poultry: and all other competitions which may be conducted at this Show.

- Entry fees are shown at the head of each Class.
- All exhibits must be the bona-fide property of exhibitor or their principal.
- Exhibitors of sheep, cattle and horses should refer to the further regulations set out in the relevant schedules.
- The Committee reserves to itself the right to disqualify any exhibit which is improperly entered or regarding which a false statement has been made.
- All exhibits for special prizes must be shown under the Society's regulation but donors may attach their own conditions, provided they do not override the Society's rules.
- Exhibitors and competitors who are not financial members of the Association, must pay gate entry. Failure to do so will result in ineligibility for competition.
- No person shall act as a Judge in any Class in which he or she is an exhibitor.
- The decision of the Judges shall be final.
- Any exhibitor or associate who initiates conversation with a judge on judging day, before, during or after judging, or questions their awards will be liable to expulsion from the Showground and may in future be disqualified from exhibiting at the Condobolin PAH & I Association Inc's Show.
- Any protest against the awarding of a prize according to the decision of the Judges must be made in writing to the Secretary not later than 5 p.m. on the second day of the Show. A protest committee consisting of members of the Committee of Management and the Stewards of the Class or section in which the protest occurs, shall deal with all protests and their decision shall be final. The sum of \$20 or \$100 for Ring A must be lodged with each protest, and this sum may be forfeited if the Committee considers the protest frivolous.
- The Society shall not be liable for any accident, loss or damage that may occur to, or be caused by any exhibit during the Show and it shall be an implied condition of every entry that the exhibitor shall hold the Society indemnified from any action or proceedings arising from such accident, loss or damage.
- The Committee reserves the right to call upon any competitor subject to age limit, at any time to furnish, at his or her expense, proof of age, and may at its discretion, withhold any prize money until such certificate or proof shall have been furnished. The age of the competitor shall be taken as on the day of appearance in the Show unless otherwise stated.
- Assistance dogs and competition dogs only are permitted on the showground. All dogs to be on leash or securely tied.

Condobolin PAH & I Association

PRESIDENTS 1885 - 2025

First President of the association, **Norman Augustus Gatenby** arrived in the district from Tasmania in the 1870s, first settling at Burra Burra (site of the present day Tullamore) and some years later buying Jemalong Station.

In 1885 he was **foundation President of the Condobolin PAH & I Association** with R D Jones as Secretary. Shortly after he was also president of the Forbes PA & H Association. Gatenby was dubbed at the time "the father of irrigation" on the Lachlan with Jemalong being widely judged the best irrigated farm in NSW. He was also a keen advocate of pit ensilage, confident that it held the solution to the drought problem and having had a paper published on the subject in 1907.

In March 1896 he also acquired Raby at Warren where in 1898 he established the famous Merino stud of that name. He lived at Jemalong for some forty years before being incapacitated by paralysis as the result of a fall. He handed over the working of his three valuable and important stations to the Australian Estates and Mortgage Company Ltd, and retired to Blackheath where he died in 1923, aged 73.

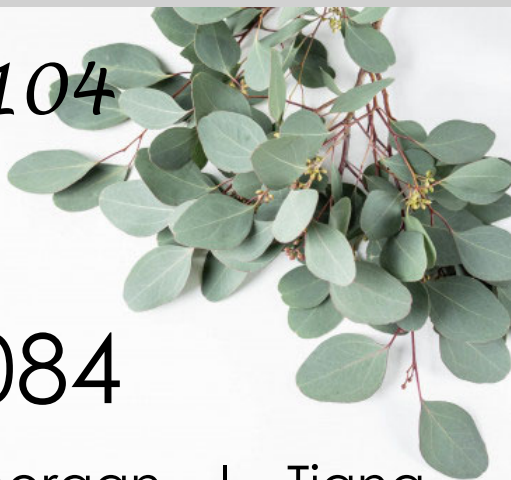

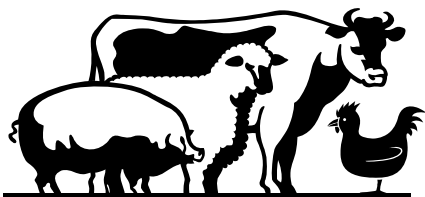

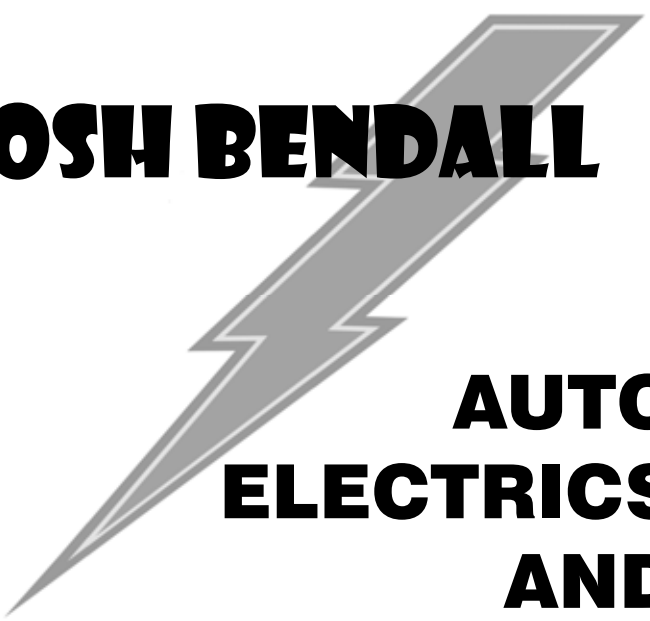

CONDOBOLIN PAH & I ASSOCIATION INC

The first Condobolin Show, conducted by what was then known as the Pastoral and Agricultural Association, was held on 5 and 6 August, 1885, on a ten-acre grant made available by the Government for a showground. It was situated until 1938 on the eastern side of town on the Parkes Road.

The first show president was Mr N A Gatenby and the first secretary, Mr R D Jones. There were sections at that first Show for Thoroughbred horses, Draught horses, Durham cattle, Merino sheep, pigs, fat stock, agricultural produce, flowers, vegetables and poultry.

By the 1930s the Show Society went under its current name, the Pastoral, Agricultural, Horticultural and Industrial Association and in 1938 conducted its first show on the SRA (Showground, Racing and Athletics) Ground site as we know it today. This Crown Land was made available to the Association through the services of Minister for Lands the Hon EA Buttenshaw MLC and the show society combined association money, donations, a bank loan and

Government grants to establish the Showground portion which included the erection of the Exhibition Hall (often later referred to as the SRA Pavilion).

The following year the Jubilee Show was staged, the year of the 50th Show allowing for shows cancelled during World War I, flood and drought years. The show was again abandoned from 1940-43 due to World War II.

One hundred years since formation the association celebrated its Centenary in 1985. Flood forced the cancellation of the 1990 Show, so in the 109th year since the formation of the PAH & I Association, Condobolin celebrated its 100th Show in 1994. With further cancellations forced by COVID-19 in 2020 and 2021, the 2026 Show will be the 130th, held in the association's 141st year.

After 76 years' service the SRA Pavilion was condemned by Lachlan Shire in 2014 and demolished in 2016 to make way for a new pavilion, the main portion of which was available for use at the 2017 Show with the official opening in November of that year. The Show Society obtained a NSW Government Grant of \$450,000 to contribute towards the overall cost. The Show Society has successfully applied for many Government grants over the years. The most notable of these in the very recent past being the NSW Government's Showground Stimulus Funding Rounds 1 and 2 which brought a replacement roof, poles and shed in the Merino pavilion among other showground works. Most notably there was also funding for electrical repairs and replacement and additional power boxes etc. This was followed by a further grant of \$294,000 which covered the balance of power upgrades including replacement of poles and wires with underground cables, transformer and upgrade and replacement of showground lighting, including over the Show ring.

The Show Society is grateful to Council for supporting these applications and in a number of cases, providing further financial support.

The winner will receive \$50 from AgShows NSW and then be required to bake a third Rich Fruit Cake for the State Final at the **2027 Sydney Royal** where the winner will receive a plaque and a cash prize of \$50.

Competitors may only represent one Show Society in a Group Final and only one Group in the State Final.

NSW RICH FRUIT CAKE COMPETITION RECIPE

Ingredients:

250g (8 oz) sultanas
250g (8 oz) chopped raisins
250g (8 oz) currants
125g (4 oz) chopped mixed peel
90g (3 oz) chopped red glacé cherries
90g (3 oz) chopped blanched almonds
1/3 (one-third) cup sherry or brandy
250g (8 oz) plain flour
60g (2 oz) self-raising flour
1/4 teaspoon grated nutmeg
1/2 teaspoon ground ginger
1/2 teaspoon ground cloves
250g (8 oz) butter
250g (8 oz) soft brown sugar
1/2 teaspoon lemon essence **or** finely grated lemon rind
1/2 teaspoon almond essence
1/2 teaspoon vanilla essence
4 large eggs

Recommended Method:

- 1 Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least one (1) hour but preferably overnight
- 2 Sift together the flours and spices
- 3 Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences
- 4 Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition; then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon
- 5 Place the mixture into a prepared **square 20cm x 20cm (8" x 8") tin** and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3½ to 4 hours
- 6 Allow the cake to cool in the tin

NOTE: To ensure uniformity and depending on the size it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces, cherries into 4-6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3-4 pieces.

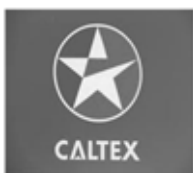

WHAT IS A FIDGET QUILT/MAT ?

A Fiddle Mat or Fidget Quilt provides gentle sensory stimulation with different fabrics, textures, colours and objects attached. They are wonderful for the restless hands of people with Alzheimer's, dementia, and autism. They soothe the fidgeting by entertaining the user, busying their hands and fingers and stimulating their senses. They are a great calming tool and give the user a relaxing tactile experience. They are also wonderful for small children and keep their hands busy.

TIPS FOR MAKING FIDGET QUILTS

- Cut two (2) 43 x 53cm pieces of material (1.5cm seam allowance included). Material can be same both sides or contrasting, patchwork, etc – your choice
- 40 x 50cm completed size
- Use soft fabrics
- Can different fabric colours and textures - cotton fabric, fake fur, flannel, denim, etc
- Embellishments – On what will be the top front piece (the right side) sew any number of your chosen embellishments. It is important that all sewing edges, including those of embellishments and threads etc are confined between the two (2) layers
- Attach interesting tactile items of different textures and functions to engage user. Examples are zippers, buttons, ribbon to feel or tie, plastic rings, small bits of crochet, buckles, beads to slide, etc - the embellishment possibilities are endless
- Securely fasten embellishments. Do not use items/materials that will fray, come loose from mat or break off
- Place right sides together and sew around edges leaving a small gap to turn out.
- Turn out to right side, place weights in corners, e.g. 20 cent pieces, sew in place. Sew up remaining gap and iron
- Mat should be completely washable

CHAMPION EXHIBIT, Sections 1 - 17 (Ribbon)

The First Condobolin Show 5 and 6 August 1885

The formation of the Pastoral and Agricultural Association, as originally named, was brought about by town and pastoral progress, similarly to other country towns of the period.

Condobolin's first Show was held on 5 and 6 August 1885, on a ten-acre grant made available by the Government for a Showground. It was situated on the Parkes Road where it remained until transferring to the present site in 1938.

The first President was Norman Gatenby of Jemalong and the Secretary was RD Jones with M Boulton, Treasurer, and DS McLeod and D Scott, Vice Presidents.

The committee were Messrs M Boulton, C Burcher, H B von Laubenfelde, D Scott and H E Stevenson. There were sections for thoroughbred and draught horses, Durham cattle, Merino sheep, pigs, fat stock, agricultural produce, flowers, vegetables and poultry.

A Show Ball was held in aid of the hospital funds in Messrs Nicolas and Reymond's Mill. Messrs Burcher and Kelly were MCs and, according to the *Forbes and Parkes Gazette*, "about 200 ladies and gentlemen continued dancing until half-past five in the morning".
