Children's (junior) sections are all free to enter. Further detail of all Classes at the Show is in the full Show Schedule which will shortly be available from the Showground Office or Condobolin Newsagency, the Library and other town businesses. Of course, children can also enter all classes in the pavilion, but an entry fee may apply if entering an open class.

All Pavilion exhibits (apart from Photography) require an entry ticket, available from the Secretary's Office until 5 p.m. Wednesday 26 August. In general, all exhibits must then be delivered to the SRA Pavilion on the morning of Thursday 27 August before 10 a.m. (to be on the safe side). The exceptions are the Photography Class where exhibits (which can be entered on the spot and don't need an entry ticket) must be delivered to the Secretary's Office by 6 p.m. on Tuesday 25 August; and the Fine Arts Class where exhibits (which can be entered with the chief steward on delivery) must be in the SRA Pavilion between 8.00 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Tuesday 25 August.

COLLECTION OF EXHIBITS and PRIZE MONEY between 5.00 and 5.30 p.m. Saturday 29 August (no sooner). No responsibility can be taken for any entries that are not collected by 6.00 p.m.

Entrants of all ages, individually or as a group, are invited to create and display a scarecrow. These need not be confined to traditional figures but may include a modern interpretation. Reflect your own personality and creativity and add further interest to this year's SRA Pavilion during the 130th Show. Refer promo on previous page.

Some aspects that judges will consider are artistic merit and visual impact, originality, workmanship and attention to detail.

CATEGORIES You have a choice of two categories that honour this year's Show theme of **The Year of the Woman Farmer**.

- 1 **LADIES IN AGRICULTURE**
- 2 **FASHIONS ON THE FIELD** (include wheat/straw)

AGE GROUPS (with 2 prizes to be awarded per group)

HOW TO ENTER

- * All entries must be suitable for public display.
- * Advise Show Secretary of name of entrant or group by Friday 21 August so sufficient space can be allocated. Late entries accepted if space permits.
- * **DELIVERY:** All entries to be in place in SRA Pavilion between 3 and 6 p.m. on Wednesday 26 August.
- * Scarecrows must be delivered fully assembled with all parts securely attached.
- * The association reserves the right to allocate alternative SRA site if necessary.
- * **COLLECTION:** Saturday 29 August between 5 and 6 p.m. (not before 5). Scarecrows may also be picked up from the Pavilion between 8.30 and 10.00 a.m. on Sunday 30th. After that time Scarecrow may have flown. Phone Secretary re any variation.
- * One entry per person or group
- * Each entry to be clearly labelled with the scarecrow name and category and the entrant's name or that of school or entity.
- * No perishable goods to be used and no pre-moulded or commercially available face masks.
- * Scarecrows must be self-supporting and have a strong support base.

HANDY HINTS

The Frame: use sturdy timber, bamboo or PVC pipes tied together in a cross shape to form the body and shoulders

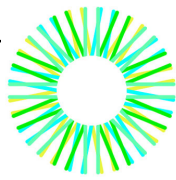
The Head: Stuff an old burlap sack, pillowcase or nylon stocking with straw, leaves or recycled bags and use markers, paint, or yarn to create a face.

The Clothes: Dress the frame in old, oversized clothes (shirts and trousers). Stuff the clothes with hay, straw or crumpled newspaper to give the scarecrow volume.
